

As with every survey issued by the VCA, we asked a few questions to ensure we have a representation of all areas of The Village.



- 197 residents completed the survey


1. How long have you been a resident of The Village? 197 responses









Are you currently a member of the Village Community Association (VCA)? 197 responses





What street do you live on?













Are you in favour of a four way stop at the intersection of Garrison Village Drive, Perez Road and Jordan Street?






Would you support deferring any change in the current parking situation on Garrison Village Drive until after a four-way stop is installed to see what impact that has?
