As of March 31, 2022, The Village Community Association had unencumbered funds totalling \$7,792.83.

Net operating surplus for the year was \$1,101.37.

Total membership revenue was \$5,040. That revenue is intended to pay for general administration, website fees, insurance and Village holiday decorating. Here is a brief summary:
